We still have no Secretary which is most disappointing and unsatisfactory, I do however thank those committee members who are helping in various ways.





The MOTOR FEST is now Australia Day CARnivale, it still organised by Australia Day Council of New South Wales.



1 March 1923 to 24 October 2012

Max was a dear friend to us all. He joined the Veteran Car Club in about 1963 (Member No. 297)

A very easy person to write about in this Club is Max Chapman, and I am pretty sure almost every member will have his story of Max's assistance to them over the years.

We have many memories of Max.

Firstly he loved to drive his car to Rallies, he felt that cars should be driven to rallies.

So we would spend hours on the phone planning a trip to a National Rally and the return trip home.

If we broke down - then we would fix it on the spot, and if you didn't have the part, Max would fabricate something from bits he was carrying in the boot of the Wolseley.

Secondly his Mechanical and Auto Electrical knowledge was extensive and he was willing to help club members no end, including me!!!.

He had a great ability to discuss minute problems on the phone.

I vividly remember describing nuts and bolts and shafts going one way and another until Max had analysed the problem.

Thirdly he was the Editor of Spit and Polish for some time in the early days. He compiled and posted the magazine himself.




