Hon Secretary's Annual Report August 2012

Firstly I would like to thank my fellow Committee Members most sincerely for their help and hard work during the year. There are also people outside the Committee who perform small but vital duties to enable the Club to function who deserve our thanks. It is gratifying to note that most of the present Committee and helpers have agreed to stand again for the ensuing year. As members may realise, with both Secretary and President in the one house it does make our lives "car Club" orientated and I would particularly like to thank our President for her serenity, patience and counsel on the Home front.

One disappointment during the year is our failure, despite the best efforts of our subcommittee and Agent, to lease the small Hall, which would provide the Club with a permanent revenue base in a time of nearly static membership and rising cost. I can only think that we are trying to lease it at the wrong time as there is certainly plenty of similar property for lease in the immediate area. However we remain ever hopeful of securing a tenant in the near future, as there are still enquiries coming in.

Our membership has remained almost static this year. We have lost some very active and highly regarded members but it is pleasing to note that we have welcomed some younger new members into the Club. With youth goes activity and I hope to see them on the road with us in the near future. Younger people have a more up to date outlook more suited to our times and it is my sincere wish to see more younger members on Committee running the Club.

Treasurer's Annual Report 2011/12

The financial posistion of the Club has remained relatively stable over the 12 months to June 2012. The total cash on hand has marginally reduced by \$650 to close at \$39,085 which reflects the current situation that the cash received during the year is fully expensed over the year.

This position over the long term does not provide provisions for any major building repairs.

There were no Capital purchases for the year.

This year expenses have increased

Electricity up \$500

Cleaning fees up due to the transfer of tennants from the small to the large hall

\$1,700 spent on preparing the small hall for potential tenants, eg electrical box split, provision of phone line)

To conclude, the Club has been able to maintain the strong financial base, however I encourage the future committee to continue to seek additional sources of income to ensure this solid base is maintained.

This is my last report as your Treasurer, I would like to thank all committee members for their patience and support during my time in charge of the cheque book.



Jean Chapman 1926 - 2012

Prolific weaver of magical tales fired young imaginations

Jean Chapman was one of Australias most popular young children's authors. She wrote tirelessly when she was a stay-at-home mother, and for many years she wrote scripts for ABC children's programs and published dozens of books. As if she wasn't busy enough, she also worked part-time in a children's bookshop, helping customers choose the best books.

Jean Erica Sherlock Lycett was born on February 15, 1926 in Sydney, the youngest of the three daughters of George Lycett and his wife, Margaret (nee MacLean). She went to Fort Street girls school in Petersham, and had her first story, about a sick cow, published in the chilldren's section of a Sunday newsspaper when she was only 12.

After finishing high school, she went to business college to learn touch typing, which was useful when she became a writer. Then she enrolled in the National Art School.

She met Max Chapman on a blind date and they were marrried after World War II. They scrimped and saved to buy a block of land in Seaforth, where they built a house.

Chapman wrote ceaselessly, and her writing career took off when she began writing for the ABC's *Kindergarten of the Air*.

Her imaginative stories were so successful that Chapman was offered a place at the ABC's scriptwriting school, graduating, in 1960, when she began working on *Playschool, Let's Join In* and *Kindergarten of the Air*. She was a scriptwriter for the ABC's children's programs for 25 years.

Chapman also began approaching children's publishers. Some early successes were followed by a long-standing association with Hodder & Stoughton (Australia), In the 1970s, it published *Tell Me A Tale*, a collection of stories, rhymes, songs and, activities illustrated by Deborah and Kilmeny Niland, the twin daughters of the authors Ruth Park and D'Arcy Niland.

The hugely successful book was followed by *Tell Me Another Tale* and themed collections such as *Pancakes and Painted Eggs* and the *Sugar Plum Christmas Book*.

Chapman published 63 books in total and won several awards for children's literature.

Children and children's books were Chapman's life's work. She frequently visited schools and libraries to speak to her readers. She was a tireless worker for the Children's Book Council of Ausstralia's NSW branch, was made a life member and was awarded the council's Lady Cutler Award for her contribution to children's literature.

She was also a member of the group that fought and won the battle to save Nutcote, the home of her fellow children's author, May Gibbs, in Neutral Bay.

In addition to her busy life as a writer, Chapman supported Max in his passion for veteran cars. They frequently travelled together on motoring trips and were active in the Veteran Car Club.

The pair travelled the world and she always had to visit chilldren's book sites, including Hans Christian Andersen's house in Denmark and Beatrix Potter's house in England.

Jean Chapman is survived by Max, their children Gregory and Louise, three grandchildren and six great-grandchildren.

Her seventh great-grandchild is due in October and Chapman had already knitted and sewn pieces for the baby's layette.

In My Shed

Max Boardman

In My Shed - my shed !! shock and absolute horror - but here we go.

Some restoration projects are large and some are small and dainty; the following are steps taken for the re-make of a porcelain high tension spark lead insulator that will be attached to the cylinder block of my 1903, 2 speed 6hp de Dion *et* Bouton.

All this for the pure satisfaction, so that upon lifting the bonnet it is there for everyone to see, just like it was when the little car left the factory all those years ago.


The trick is to be able to get your hands onto an original unit to begin with (G R) and/or by spending time researching early period pictures of these cars when 'nearly' new. Some good photos were sourced from the 'net' of an Australian manufacturer, namely that of the Lewis Motor Cycle website. The Lewis workshop assembled and repaired De Dion Bouton motors in and around the 1904/5 period.



Step One: I fabricated from a piece of fine grained and suitably stable piece of timber a 'pattern', that was enlarged 13% above the 'original' to allow for shrinkage on drying of the moist porcelain. On completion this timber then had the grain sealed for stability; it also improves its releasing qualities from the 'casting' mould.

Step Two: The mould was created by the *Potter* after he made a very careful decision as to where the join for the mould separation should occur. The two halves of the mould are formed so as to only go together one way and making sure the newly formed shape created will in actual fact be released from the mould without damage. The mould was then 'set' to ensure a hard durable casting block.

Note the two locating dimples, male and female and the opening for excess material to escape.



Step Three: The pliable porcelain mixture is forced into the hardened mould to form the exterior shape of the de Dion insulator. The newly formed soft shape is carefully removed on splitting the mould in half and excess material cut off.

On removal and after initial drying the porcelain insulator will have the two holes 'drilled' through. One hole is for the brass mounting bolt and the other is for the insulated high tension lead to pass through, that being the lead that goes to the sparking plug. (see last photograph)

The unit is now fully 'air' dried. It was at this stage of the process a couple of units were lost due to shrinkage and drying cracks that occurred on the surface.

Step Four: the newly formed shapes are lightly 'glazed' and then 'fired' in the kiln to form the finished item. Just like the original.

Note: time span from commencing the 'turned' timber shape to final 'firing' in the kiln was about 9 to 10 months and quite a number of trips to and from the Potter.

Step Five: a proud creator places the finished item(s) on the shelf in the glass cabinet and begins another small but important project for this true veteran car having Crankcase Number 13077 and Cylinder Block stamped and dated, the number $\mathbf{M} \circ \mathbf{-6} \cdot \mathbf{\circ}$ (that being the 6^{th} June 1903).

PostScript:- on speculation I phoned a telephone number placed in a club journal (not S & P) thinking that I knew the person, (it turned out I didn't) but this did not stop me from offering him a small piece of porcelain to add to his own 6hp de Dion powered *Lascota*, that is if the second firing and glazing were to be successful. The purpose of the phone call was that I was hopeful of acquiring an automatic inlet valve and manifold assembly; instead it turned out his to be for a twin cylinder model.




LHS - Timber pattern placed in mould.
