



Just ask anyone who knew Dad, he wasn't one for body work, he just loved to drive!



A very sad year for us all, with the passing of two great stalwarts of the Veteran Car Club, and in particular, the Newcastle Branch. Peter Adams and Ray Thomas. Both well respected members of the branch and friends to us all.

The loss of friends from any club can have a dampening effect on membership and can cause some to reflect on his or her being. Peter and Ray would both want us to get on with club matters and activities as such.

Our two major events for the year, Maitland and Singleton are significant events on our calendar, both attract members from far and near, these events are not without some planning, organising and at times frustration. Although small in numbers they are a good grounding for bigger events, in particular the 2018 National of which the branch has carriage of. I am confident that we are ready for the task; we do have a practice event in September this year with the hosting of the National Hupmobile rally in Singleton. I am sure this event will offer some learning opportunities and good take–a-ways for future planning.

As for the National in 2018, Forbes has been locked in, dates have been set and I can now announce that Jeff Palmer will be the event Treasurer. Next year will see the real work start with further visits to Forbes and a lot of planning to draft and then test. Volunteers for jobs and all round organising of the first National event where all entered vehicles will be a minimum of 100 years old.

To branch events: the change to the structure of the January outing proved rewarding and the other monthly runs have been well supported. The 100 year Birthday event is nearing its end with only 1917 and 1918 to run, some cars eagerly awaiting their day in the spotlight. I am sure the event will continue as it has developed into a well-attended run.

Unfortunately, the weather has caused some events to be postponed throughout the reporting year, the run into the Newcastle museum was somewhat dampened but we will reschedule for next year.

Some changes have been made within the Conditional Registration Scheme for NSW allowing eligible vehicles to be used much more widely and without a lot of club control: I support this initiative but am also aware of the spirit of the Veteran Car Club. It is much easier for "30 year rule" clubs as all eligible vehicles can attend their runs and activities; not so for the Veteran car club. We are to foster the restoration and preservation of Veteran Vehicles and as such our events should be attended in your veteran or modern vehicle. Attending in your "30 year rule" vehicle on your sixty day permit, detracts from the spirit of the club. I am sure that the Services NSW trial period will develop into continued practice as I believe it should. Yet as veteran vehicles owners and members of the Veteran Car Club we need to stay focused on the use of our veteran vehicles at every opportunity.

Well done to those who have recently completed your restoration project, or repairs; the number of veteran vehicles owned by branch members is growing. In essence this should see an increased number of vehicles on tours as some family members and friends are becoming interested in Veteran vehicles.

A thought to close on:

Next year 2017 will see the fifty-fifth year since the late George Adams Chaired the first Branch meeting. Let's have a party to celebrate that occasion and all that has gone before and all yet to come.

Auto-Biography 1903 Darracq

Automobiles Darracq SA was a French motor vehicle manufacturing company founded in 1896 by Alexandre Darracq. In 1902, Alexandre Darracq signed a contract with Adam Opel to jointly produce vehicles in the German Empire under the brand name "Opel Darracq". In late 1902, a consortium of London financial interests initiated a takeover of Darracq resulting in the creation of A Darracq and Co Ltd. Alexandre Darracq was managing director. In 1905 the company expanded to Britain, incorporating as the A Darracq Company (1905) Limited. In the summer of 1912, following the failure of a range of new models incorporating a rotary valve under Henriod patents, Alexandre Darracq resigned and retired from the motor industry.

During World War I, the Darracq factory was converted to the production of various war materials. In 1919 Darracq took over Clement Talbot including the British Talbot and Talbot models. Cars built at Suresnes were then marketed as Talbot-Darracq. The company merged with the Sunbeam Motor Car Co in 1920 and the name changed to STD Motors Ltd. Cars built at Suresnes, and early examples of the 8hp built by London Talbot, were badged as Talbot-Darracq.

In 1935 Rootes took over Sunbeam and Talbot following the bankruptcy of STD Motors and they bought the plant at Suresnes. Cars built there were eventually called Talbot-Lago, but up to 1939 they continued to be badged as Darracq, if they were imported into Great Britain to avoid infringing Rootes Group's right to the Talbot name in Great Britain. Though the Darracq name survived on those of the Sunbeam-Talbot-Darracq group's products destined for Britain or its Empire, it was no more than a very convoluted exercise in badge-engineering, and the latter history of the cars from Suresnes form part of the Sunbeam and Talbot stories.

I can trace ownership as far back as 1910. The then current owner was Mr B. Weir of Woodville, South Australia. The





car was subsequently stored in a barn on his property until Mr Albert Edward Vinnal bought it around the late 1950's or early 1960's. I bought it from him around 1982. At that time it was completely disassembled and boxed, but complete in nearly all respects. I have since restored it to its original condition as much possible.

It was a great pleasure to find so many missing original parts (water hoses and the upholstery), and to find the original parking lights, one headlight, one tail light and the horn. These accessories are all from the same manufacturer (Herm Riemann). In fact, finding all these original accessories together was a bigger surprise than finding the car!

The vehicle is a one cylinder and 3 speed gear box and reverse, it has a leather clutch and

has over drive. The car has been accepted as one cylinder 1903, by the Veteran car Club of South Australia and is eligible for the London to Brighton run.

For those with long memories and a love of old black and white movies the car featured in the 1953 British film *Genevieve* was a 1904 Darracq.

"Fifty-Bob"

This was a letter from W.M. (Sandy) Holmes to his brother Keith Holmes after his record breaking run from Sydney to Melbourne in his car, Vauxhall 'Fifty-Bob', in 1956. He was trying to better the original record run by Boyd Edkins in the same car in 1916 whom did it from Melbourne to Sydney in 16 hours and 55 minutes.

George Hotel St Kilda Monday

Dear Keith,

Scrounged this paper to write on.

To start at the beginning.

Left home at 2.20 am Saturday morning. Arrived G.P.O. Sydney at about 3.05. Rained all the way in. Waiting for us, & looking a little worried because we were late, were Jim Simpson, Bill Bolderstone & Bill's brother. Waited until 3.15 am before departing as I was expecting Bill Daly to turn up. He may have brought in some petrol for me to top up the tank. At the Town Hall came on Jack Butcher who had thought we were going from there. Got him to sign the scroll saying we had left at 3.15. The others had already done this. Bill Bolderstone had had a rather neat sheet turned out a copy of which, signed by all of us, was received by each at the start. Must try to get one of these for Jack Butcher if he would like it. Will show you mine when I come home. Very grateful to these chaps for turning out at such an ungodly hour on such a lousy night.

A garage was open at Liverpool & we topped up there. Next stop Goulbourn to top up again. Had got bitterly cold by this – we wore our plastic coats to keep warm until 10 am. Left Goulbourn at 7.00 am. Didn't rain after Sydney although still overcast.

Outside Berrima is a stretch of wavy road about 1 mile long. 5 or 6 feet from crest to trough. Peg had a very rough trot on this & I thought she would be ill. She was airborne half the time & half through the floor the rest of the time. She turned white & had a bad stomach ache for several hours after.

Stopped at Yass to top up. At each petrol stop I also checked oil, tyres, water, etc. This was about every 100 miles, although much frequent stops were not a necessity. Arrived Gundagai about 10 am about 10 minutes ahead of schedule. Again topped up.

Somewhere between Gundagai & Albury lost a hub cap. Very unhappy about this.

Only place on trip where gradient made a change down necessary was Jugiong Hill. Changed down to 3^{rd} & then to 2^{nd} & 1^{st} when came up behind heavy truck. Passed him on only part where passing permitted & then went up through 2^{nd} to peak revs in 3^{rd} as we went over the top. Very steep but comparatively short hill. Best view on trip from top of hill looking back over Jugiong & Murrumbidgee River.

Dropping down the Victorian side of a watershed between Gundagai & Albury doing about 55 mph came upon a big "hump" sticking out of the middle of path. Possibly caused by heavy trucks braking or uneven or watery subsoil etc. Would have collected sump anyway. Couldn't go to right of it because of oncoming car, so had to take violent evasive action to left over rough surface, although still half on tar. Glad I was in Fifty Bob & not new car as it held very well, although nearly lost Peg through bouncing out. Semi-trailer was stopped about 75/100 yds past bump with driver standing beside – seemed likely that "bump" had done him some damage. Could not have stopped closer than 200/300 yds past him (as I was still working hard) to see whether he needed help. In any case there were several semis only a short distance behind me.

Arrived Albury 1.15 pm half hour ahead of schedule. Spent 15 minutes finding Jim Pearsall Secty (*Secretary*) of Albury Car Club who was to act as liaison. He didn't think we would arrive until 2 pm & had arranged for us on the way through at this time. However he insisted that we leave without waiting for this although this probably caused him some bother, alas wouldn't allow me to cover cost of phone call to Melbourne – said Car Club would bear this. Seems particularly nice chap & I must think of a way to repay him for help. Also topped up with petrol here.

Because very hot after leaving Gundagai – sunny with no breeze whatsoever although till then we had very strong headwinds. Pearsall lead us through Albury to Wodonga with fellow club member with modern Vauxhall who took some photos.

Earlier had stopped about 7 miles north Albury, took out floor took off cover of gearbox & inspected oil level. I still have the leaking seals, but didn't need to top up as much as expected. Used a little over $\frac{1}{2}$ gallon of oil all told in gearbox so far (ie. to today).

After Albury came the worst part of the trip – great long straight stretches of road running approx W.S.W. with an afternoon sun. Have worst face burn ever. 3^{rd} degree burns on nose – plasma is seeping through surface. Can now understand why Boyd Edkins went Melbourne - Sydney not vice versa.

Stopped Wangaratta over 15 minutes for petrol, soft drinks & ice blocks. Also put air in offside rear tyre which was down a bit. Temperature here was over 90 degrees in shade – garage chappy rather distressed by it & cars with bonnets up everywhere although saw some people hereabouts playing tennis.

I seemed to have lost some nerve after leaving Albury which I didn't regain until it became cooler about 5 pm. Also was driving the car slower, about 45 m.p.h., because of the heat. There wasn't a breath of wind & the sky didn't have a cloud in it. I can guarantee this as I was looking for them.

About 5 mile south of Benalla car wasn't "bouncing" quite right so inspected tyres. Offside rear was about half down and almost red hot. Changed to spare & had a cool drink. Took ¹/₄ hour here on a stop which should have taken about 8-10 minutes at most. We were then ¹/₄ hour behind schedule.

Somewhere around here the oil pressure started to drop & went down to about 4-6 lbs from the 10 to 12 it had been in the hot running, (15-18 to Yass in the cold). Nearly had pups & began to drive with judicious care but trying to hold a 35 m.p.h. average. Only about 70 miles from Melbourne found cause. The oil line to the gauge had fractured (cracked) just near the gauge & I already had a pair of pants soaking in Castrol "R". Being about body temperature when hitting me I hadn't noticed it before.

This accounted for the drop & being cooler, I started to put on the pressure again. In the last 30 - 35 miles to Melbourne outer suburbs we picked up 10 minutes. Needless to say I haven't mentioned this to the police as I must have been driving at something like 70 m.p.h. during most of this time. The road was perfect & almost straight.

About 8 miles from G.P.O. Ron Cheney & family picked us up in their car & led us in. Without him we wouldn't have stood a chance of getting in at the time we did. Farther in we were joined by Theo Bragg, Alan Provan & Geoff Vine in their cars.

Clocked in at G.P.O. at 7.20 pm - 16 hrs 5 mins after leaving Sydney. Bit disappointed that we didn't do the 16 hrs but the tyre stop & lost time at Albury contributed to this. Felt remarkably fresh at the end - didn't get to bed till 10.30. Next day OK except for stiff right arm & leg.

Won't say much about the Rally will tell you when I come home. Of 45 entries + 1 started. The conditions of some of them would put any of our Club's to shame, with due regard to our own chaps. Have taken photos of a fair number of the cars. Should be alright if they turn out O.K. Most impressive was Miss Duckett's Isotta. 2 seater sports with 2 bolster tanks at back – perfect.

We got the prize for farthest distance although I haven't seen it yet. I think Wagenar from S.A. was a bit disappointed not to get this. He drove over starting Saturday morning & arrived just before Rally & immediately after started on way back to arrive next night. A pleasant chap, had his wife with him. He may come to our Run next year in his Studebaker. Told him he would be given a good time in Sydney.

Only complaint is the average set. Although only 20 m.p.h. I found this impossible to maintain through the traffic & crowds although Geoff Vince led me in his Rover in excess of what I would have done in normal driving. We dropped 7 points on time all told & of course were not in the hunt on condition.

Had quite a yarn to Peter Dale & inspected his Hispano Suiza Boulogne Surbaisse Vitesse (?). This is in almost chassis form, in perfect condition & obviously made never to have troubles or breakages. A super motor car.

Although from betters in Motor Sport etc I had obtained the opinion that he would not be a very likeable character, this doesn't seem to be so & I have changed my opinion.

Will keep the rest for when I get home. May not arrive till Monday, not certain yet.


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
