Techie Talk

Barry Shinfield queried the comment from the CMC regarding the use of ethanol mixes. He commented on the size of some clubs joining the CMC.

His technical topic was about tapered pins which are used in veterans to hold gears or a cam onto a shaft. They are usually made of mild steel. The pins become more tightly lodged when forced into a <u>Course of Diameter of</u>

Picton Valley Motel is situated on 5 picturesque acres, has plenty of room for car trailers and beautifully appointed rooms. Our host has kindly offered VCCA members substantially discounted rates on accommodation - a standard queen room will cost \$95.00 per night. (Normally it would cost \$115.00 on Friday night and \$125.00 on Saturday night). Book directly with the motel but mention that you are part of the VCCA rally to get the discount. Other room types are available - twin single, deluxe queen and family and will also be discounted.

Please note that this is a veteran car only rally. If your veteran lets you down at the last minute please come anyway and we will almost certainly be able to find you a seat in a veteran.

On Friday afternoon we will have a shakedown run of around 57.8 km (round trip) visiting Wirrimbirra Sanctuary, Bimbo's and the Nepean Dam. Evening dinner will be in the motel ballroom.

On Saturday we will have a tour of about 115 km (shortcuts available) We will visting The Oaks Heritage Centre for a guided tour, video and morning tea (a distance of 36.1 km). Then we will proceed to "Cow Pastures" farm for lunch (the official route being 46.7 km but a number of shortcuts are available down to as little as 19.6 km). After lunch we will have a "motorkhana" which will have some vehicle based events and some other novelty events. There will also be an opportunity to give people who may not have driven a veteran a chance to have a go in a paddock. Then its 32.3 km back to the motel (with the short cut route being 28.4 km) In the evening the rally dinner (period costume optional) will again be in the motel ballroom. In the event of heavy rain our backup plan would be to visit the "National Studebaker Museum of Australia" in place of the farm.

:On Sunday morning we will travel the short distance (9.6 km) to "Train works" at Thirlmere to visit the museum and have a ride on a steam train around 11:00am returning around 11:50am Then (unfortunately) its time to return to the motel and head for home.

The routes have been designed to largely avoid long steep hills and there are simple shortcuts available on the Saturday run so that the rally should suit lower powered veterans as well as their more "long legged" relations.

The entry fee is \$10.00 per vehicle.

Saturday morning tea and museum entry is \$10.00 per person. Saturday lunch / afternoon tea is \$ 12.00 per person. Sunday museum entry and steam train ride is \$21.00 per person (group discount)

Friday dinner is \$35.00 per person - payable to the motel Saturday hot and cold breakfast is \$20.00 per person - payable to the motel Saturday dinner is \$35.00 per person - payable to the motel Sunday hot and cold breakfast is \$20.00 per person - payable to the motel

The only veteran car I can remember Barry owning was his 1911 Le Zebre which he wrote about in Spit and Polish recently. Barry purchased the car when he was 19 and kept it until he was in his early 80's.

I first met Barry and Trish when I would go to visit my sister and her family at Lindfield. They lived in the same street just two doors apart and we often meet in the street with Barry tuning up the Le Zebre so if he was lucky it may be able to drive up the steep hill to go on a car outing. Barry was always happy to talk about the car and what he was doing to improve the performance of the vehicle.

Later when I joined the VCCA Club I can remember Barry and Trish attending the Newcastle run and the Blue Mountains run enjoying the fellowship with other members.

The last event Barry attended was when the club was invited to display the cars at the Hydro Majestic Hotel at Meadow Bath. Barry and I went to see the old building where he first found the Le Zebre, on the other side of the railway line, it was the same joy as the first discovery he made at 15 years old.

Singleton Weekend - 16-18/06/17

Friday 16th.

The Newman/Gotley/Preston contingent of Talbots headed off to Cessnock at 8am and arrived at the home of Max and Joan's at 9.30am., after a short deviation at Nulkaba, just out of Cessnock due to road works Quite a number of cars were already there when we arrived and a few more arrived after us. This bridge when completed in August 1994 formed the largest cellular stress laminated hardwood timber bridge deck in the world. Measuring 60 metres long & 8.5 metres wide, the deck was assembled on the western approach. When completed the deck was launched into position with the aid of hydraulic jacks & bailey rocker rollers. Weighing in excess of 200 tonnes this was the largest or heaviest structure ever launched in this manner.

Arriving at Gresford we went down and had a look at the old St Anne's church and the suspension bridge near the church.

A Brief History - Dailmer (The Veteran Years)


Daimler a prominent English motor vehicle company was awarded a Royal Warrant in 1902 this warrant allowed them to provide cars to the British Monarch. (The warrant was awarded to Rolls Royce in the 1950's). The first Monarch was Edward VII who had purchased a new 22hpDaimler car around the tum of the century.

The history begins with Frederick Richard Simms. Simms an English bom mechanical engineer had met Gottlieb Daimler in the late 1880's, this meeting resulted in Simms acquiring all Daimler's engine patent rights for the United Kingdom. By 1893 Simms was fitting Daimler engines to launches to trade on the Thames. Simms was keeping a close watch on European advancement in motor car production and in 1895 the first Daimler engine car was used in England. Simms established the British Motor Syndicate who purchased the Daimler patent rights from Simms.

One of the syndicate members was Harry Lawson. Lawson could see prosperous times ahead and established the Daimler Motor Company. Lawson believed he could control the British motor industry and set fourth purchasing every motor patent that was available squandering vast sums of capital mostly on worthless patents. Mean while the DMC was producing many models of automobile under the supervision of the works manager J.S. Critchley. By 1902 Daimler was producing twin and four cylinder engines in HP ranges from 4.5 to 24. Post 1902 Daimler concentrated on a three model range designed

by Edmund Lewis. Four and six cylinder engines were produced but in 1908 the company placed all its efforts on Refinement of their motor vehicle when they acquired the manufacturing rights of the Knight Sleeve-valve engine. The Sleeve-valve engine was designed by Charles Yale Knight of Wisconsin. Dr Frederick Lanchester developed it further for use by Daimler and it became the single power source for all Daimler autos. Daimler had met its goal on refinement producing tall stately cars going about the streets in silence with only a faint haze of oil smoke left behind.

In 1910 a merger with the Birmingham Small Arms (BSA) Company resulted in some

rationalization of both organisations with the development and introduction of all metal bodies for some models.

During this time Daimler were also producing commercial vehicles that had great success and were sold world wide. Daimler trucks and buses were used extensively during the First World War. Daimler also produced munitions and aeroplanes as well as motor vehicles during the war years they also produced a 105hp Daimler engine to power the first tank.




