Federal Meeting - Shepparton Sept 2013

Although the final submission has not been released by the federal Sec, I thought I should send to you the draft minutes of the federal meeting conducted in Shepparton.

Main points:

- 2, The charter of Turin, The federal sec is to write to the commonwealth government (ministers) to inform them of our existence and that we are the sme for historic vehicles in Australia.
- 3, International rallies, Francis gave an outline of the time and efforts in running a FIVA international rally, need to give plenty of notice.
- 4, Member roster, sec to send out template for electronic version to be used as interim until next national roster is printed.
- 5, ACT sort permission to run national event outside of ACT boundary, due to the poor response to recent event. NSW stated that as long as consultation and communication was kept up this should not have any effect on state events as long as communication is kept up.
- 6, Generic guide lines for national events, well under way sec will circulate. point to note guide only.
- 7, national chair TAS, next meeting at the WA rally. Once the final release of the minutes is available I will send. the copy attached is draft only.






1912 Vulcan returns to King Island after 57 years!

Our visit to King Island had been planned well in advance. Geoff's grandparents migrated from Desborough in the English Midlands and took up a soldier settlement on the island in 1922. When he left England Geoff's father, Monty, was two years old and he grew up on the island. In 1931 Monty won a scholarship and attended high school in Launceston. He completed his leaving certificate and returned to the island working on the family dairy farm and in the newly opened scheelite mine. In 1940 he enlisted in the RAAF and never returned again to live on the island. His parents left the island in 1954 and only one of Geoff's cousins continues to live on the island.

It was a nostalgic visit meeting with cousin Dorothy and her husband, finding the remains of the family farm, a family grave and learning more of the history of the island. Of course, there was an unexpected twist. On the morning of our departure, we decided to pay a quick visit to the King Island Annual Show. There in a display of historic and classic vehicles we spied a veteran car - a 1912 Vulcan. Painted green, the Vulcan immediately attracted our attention.

Now the Vulcan belongs to Fred Daly but it was originally owned by the Hardy family who imported the car from England. The Vulcan is believed to be the first car on the island and it was purchased for £295. In 1957 the car was auctioned as part of the Hardy family's homestead. In the catalogue the car is described as a *Vulcan car, horn in working order, probably*

King Island's first car. The car features gas lamps, air conditioning (a vent opening), four cylinder engine and accommodates four in bench seats front and back. John Hewitt purchased the car and subsequently he moved to Launceston taking the car with him. Fred Daly first saw the car in 1957 as it was being loaded onto a trailer after the sale. Fred wondered why anyone would buy a heap of absolute rubbish. The new owner Les Hewitt restored the car to almost its original state.


In the meantime, about 40 years ago, Fred's wife when digging in their garden unearthed the radiator mascot for the Vulcan – a die cast blacksmith holding a wheel against an anvil. They stored it in a special place on the mantel piece. Fred thinks it must have come off the Hardy's car and been removed by Hewitt children who played with children who lived on Fred's property at the time. In 2008 when Fred and his wife were holidaying in northern Queensland by chance they met the brother-in-law of John Hewitt, the son of Les Hewitt who had purchased the Vulcan. After contacting John and lengthy negotiations Fred purchased the Vulcan in 2013 so the Vulcan returned to the island after an absence of 57 years. Searoad Logistics sponsored the freight and

TasPorts waived the wharfage. It seems as if the car was destined to return to King Island.

Fred with the help of a friend, Steve Archer, has restored the car's paintwork and reupholstered the seats. He has run the car. The magneto needs some tinkering to run smoothly. Fred now owns three mascots. The horn needs a reed to be in working order! Fred plans to have the car on permanent display in the King Island Historical Museum but first a suitable display needs to be built. Fred is the very proud owner of the 1912 Vulcan – what he once considered a heap of absolute rubbish!









In 1903 John I.Thornycroft & Co built a launch to compete in the new Marine Motoring Association races, to the 30' class rules.

As builders of high speed steam launches, Torpedo Boats and Warships, they had in recent years become



interested in Lorries and could see the internal combustion engine opportunities for all their products, including expansion into cars. They must have recognised that the Thornycroft A4 engine they were developing for a car would be ideal for their boat. The engine was 4 cylinders 3,576cc and delivered 20 horsepower.

As Thornycroft's specialised in iron craft, the hull's construction was put out to the local wooden boat building specialist, Frank Maynard on Jan 20th 1903, with a contract speed of 16 knots. The world record at the time being *Mercedes* at 23 mph

1903 The Racing Year

As Selwyn Edge had won the Gordon Bennett Trophy the previous year in his Napier, Britain was required to hold the

trophy, but could not because there was a 12mph speed limit on mainland. It was accepted that as Ireland didn't have a speed limit and at that time was part of Britain, they would host the event.

Gordon Bennett's contemporary Alfred Harmsworth, owner of the Daily Mail offered to give a trophy for a Motor Boat Race, and the running of the event was passed to the Automobile Club, (now the Royal Automobile Club) and arrangements were made for it to take place in Cork Harbour.

John. E. Thornycroft and his younger brother Tom entered the first running of the Harmsworth Trophy, but their intended entry a 40 foot boat called "Champak" was not 'race ready' so Scolopendra was entered as her trials had shown she was surprisingly fast for her modest power.

1903 - The first Harmsworth Trophy Race

The rules of the Harmsworth Trophy were simple the entry came from a country, as the contest should be a test of nations rather than individuals, so the boat which had to be under 40' in length, its engine (unlimited power), and 2 crew had to all come from the same country.

The Trophy being only awarded and promoted early in 1903, received only a few entries,

- 1. Selwyn Edge with a 75 HP *Napier*, 40' in length, and purpose built for the race.
- 2. Mr Beadle's launch, *Durendal* 30 feet in length, driven by a 52 horse power, eight-cylinder, M.M. Co gasoline motor, being 2 of 4 cylinder engines, bolted together.
- 3. *Mercedes*, 40' and with an 80HP engine, was to be Napiers main competitor, though as with the cars this was consumed in the Cannstatt fire, so an entry came from France, but was ineligible under the rules, as the hull was made in France.

Scolopendra

Napier won easily, with her purpose built hull and large power advantage over *Scolopendra*, however in the Yachtsman's Trophy that followed, as it was a handicap race, it was *Scolopendra* that triumphed, as she did in the Cowes Cup a month later. *Scolopendra* received much praise for her speed and efficiency, and her stern design and hull form were emulated by many builders.

The Harmsworth Trophy became the first International Motor Boat Racing Trophy, and *Scolopendra* is the only survivor, and probably the oldest purpose built racing motor boat. As with the Napier boat and cars, she was the first

to be painted what is now called "British Racing Green" though it was originally a lighter Shamrock or Emerald Green shade than has become common today.

1904 - Gunboat Years

In January 1904 she was bought by the Canadian Govt to join their Coast Guard Cruiser *Petrel*, and later *CGS Valiant* to patrol Lake Erie to combat smugglers and particularly fishing poaching from the USA's port at Erie. This had become such a serious problem it was known as the Fishing Wars, and as the *CGS Petrel* was too slow so *Scolopendra* was used as an armed high speed chase boat, in which shots were fired frequently, fishing boats seized, and sadly on one occasion 2 lives



1912 - Recreational Launch

After being sold out of the Coast Guard, she returned to some local racing near Toronto, before being bought by a Mr Kitchen in 1919, a Contractor at Parry Sound who used her for building houses and for recreational lake use. Mr kitchen modernised *Scolopendra*, with a new engine, cockpit, seating arrangement, and she lost the last 5', her distinctive Beaver Stern.

I bought her last year, to restore her to her original specification. We're fortunate in having copies of some of her original plans, and quite a bit of period information from the Yachting and Motor Magazines of 1903 and 1904.

The photo of her state in Feb 2014 shows the new ribs, engine bearers and stern taking shape, but the biggest problem is sourcing a Thornycroft A4. 2 have survived in cars, and there is one that has been sawn in half to make a 2 cylinder.

However someone in Australia a few years ago contacted Hampshire Museum archives who also have some of the Thornycroft papers, and vehicle collection at their Milestones Museum, with photos of one being used to power a wood saw. The contact information is sadly lost, though the photos attached survive and I hope that someone in the Veteran World in Australia may know of its existence and help put me in touch.

Thanks again and I'll keep my fingers crossed!



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
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
