#### **RMS Logbook Trial**

Doug Fulford outlined the scheme. He stressed that even if the club opts in members may continue on the old rego

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scheme if they wish to do so. He asked the Secretary to read an email from Barry Shinfield, which recommended that the club opt in it. Doug referred members to the RMS website for more details. The RMS gives instructions on how members can opt into the scheme. At the moment it costs the same as normal rego. About 50% of car clubs have already opted in.

Members were invited to express their views.

Graeme Newman noted that it gives members more freedom to attend local events without waiting for an invitation. Doug commented that it was the first time a minister of the crown was seen to encourage the use of historic vehicles on the road.

In response to concerns that costs could increase, Phillip Campbell replied on behalf of Shannons Insurance. He said that at the moment Shannons had no plans to increase premiums. From the experience in Victoria Shannons had made no changes to premiums.

Ian Streatfeild saw an advantage in the scheme as he could change his car from full rego to historic rego with the logbook requirement for recreational use.

The members voted 17 in favour and two against so the motion was passed.



#### **Classic Vehicle Log Book Trial**

Extracts from the RMS web site Classic Vehicle Log Book Trial

Transport for NSW and Roads and Maritime Services have developed a Classic Vehicle Log Book trial. A classic vehicle is 30 years of age or older.

#### About the trial

The log book trial will allow classic vehicles to be used for 60 days of general use (ie maintenance and personal use) each year, outside of club organised events. Each day's use must be recorded in a log book issued at a registry or service centre.

The log book trial will operate for two years, with an evaluation to be completed during this period as part of Roads and Maritime's review of the overall Conditional Registration Scheme.

#### Staged implementation

The log book trial has two stages:

Stage 1 - From 1 October 2015, vehicles that are in, or eligible to be in, the existing Historic Vehicle Scheme can be part of the log book trial. The registered operator must be a member of a Roads and Maritime recognised historic vehicle club that is participating in the log book trial.

Stage 2 - In early 2016, a Modified Classic Vehicle Scheme will be introduced. These vehicles will be eligible for conditional registration and can be included in the log book trial. For more details, see <a href="What is the proposed">What is the proposed</a> Modified Classic Vehicle Scheme?

#### Questions and answers

#### General

We are an existing recognised club under the Historic Vehicle Scheme that wants to participate in the log book trial. It is not compulsory for clubs to participate in the log book trial. However, recognised clubs must notify Roads and Maritime if they want to participate. Roads and Maritime will maintain a list of participating clubs.

Clubs' Responsible Persons may notify their participation to Roads and Maritime by email at Historic.vehicle.logbook.trial@rms.nsw.gov.au

I have a conditionally registered historic vehicle and I am a member of a participating historic vehicle club.

Members of participating recognised clubs may opt-in to the log book trial from 1 October 2015. To opt in, the registered vehicle operator or their representative must attend a registry or service centre and present:

Proof of identity such as a NSW driver licence

The current Certificate of Conditional Registration (if available)

The current Certificate of Approved Operations (if available)

A completed Change of Records (PDF, 223Kb) to have the vehicle's conditions updated.

*The following condition will be added to the vehicle's existing conditions:* 

'Classic Log Book – May be used for 60 days per year subject to log book conditions.

Operators of existing conditionally registered historic vehicles will be issued:

Certificate of Conditional Registration

Certificate of Approved Operations, with the updated conditions

Classic Vehicle Log Book Trial form.

There is no cost to existing members that choose to opt into the log book trial.

If I decide to opt-in, when will the 60 days commence?

You can use the log book once it is issued. The log book will be aligned with the annual term of the conditionally registered vehicle. The allocation of days will apply as shown in this table:

Remaining Registration	Allocated Log Book days
Up to three months	15
Over three and up to six months	30
Over six and up to nine months	45
Over nine months	60

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I have an unregistered/fully registered historic vehicle and I want to apply for conditional registration.

You will first need to join a recognised historic vehicle club (PDF, 400Kb).

If you want to opt-in to the log book trial for historic vehicles, you will need to join a recognised historic vehicle club that is participating in the log book trial.

If you are converting from full registration to conditional registration, you must surrender the full registration and number plates. You may be eligible for a refund of the unused portion of the vehicle tax or registration charge. Please note that a cancellation fee applies. You may also have the full registration number plates reserved at the registry or service centre or issued to a different vehicle for a fee. Distinctive historic vehicle number plates are issued with the conditional registration for a fee. You may also be eligible for a Compulsory Third Party (CTP) insurance premium refund. Please contact your CTP insurer for more information.

#### For recognised clubs

How do recognised clubs participate in the log book trial?

As part of determining their rules, recognised clubs may decide to participate in the log book trial. Once the club has decided, the club's Responsible Person can notify Roads and Maritime Services by email at: Historic.vehicle.logbook.trial@rms.nsw.gov.au.

How can recognised clubs confirm that they are listed as a log book trial participant?

By checking the Roads and Maritime Recognised Historic Vehicle Club list (PDF, 400Kb).

How can Roads and Maritime be sure that only recognised clubs' Responsible Person have notified their participation in the log book trial?

Roads and Maritime has the details of recognised clubs' Responsible Persons. Notification to participate will only be accepted from the Responsible Person.

What if Roads and Maritime incorrectly lists our club is a participant?

The club's Responsible Person should notify Roads and Maritime by email at:

<u>Historic.vehicle.logbook.trial@rms.nsw.gov.au</u> and the list will be updated.

Can recognised clubs withdraw their participation in the log book trial?

Yes. This means that from the date the club is removed from the participation list, no further club members may optin. However, log books already issued to club members continue to be valid.

We are a recognised club. Do we have a role in the management of log books?

Roads and Maritime does not require recognised clubs to manage any aspect of log books. However, clubs may choose to introduce their own arrangements under their respective club rules.

Is there a deadline for recognised clubs to notify their participation in the log book trial?

No. Recognised clubs may notify their participation at any time during the two year log book trial period.

#### For recognised club members

How does a member of a recognised club opt-in to the trial?

Members of participating recognised clubs may opt-in to the log book trial from 1 October 2015. To opt in, the registered vehicle operator or their representative must attend a registry or service centre and present:

Proof of identity such as a NSW driver licence

*The current Certificate of Conditional Registration (if available)* 

The current Certificate of Approved Operations (if available)

A completed Change of Records (PDF, 223Kb) to have the vehicle's conditions updated.

*The following condition will be added to the vehicle's existing conditions:* 

Classic Log Book – May be used for 60 days per year subject to log book conditions.

*Operators of existing conditionally registered historic vehicles will be issued:* 

Certificate of Conditional Registration

Certificate of Approved Operations, with the updated conditions

Classic Vehicle Log Book Trial form.

Is there a cost to opt-in to the log book trial?

There is no cost to opt-in to the log book trial.

Will there be an increase in the cost of Compulsory Third Party (CTP) insurance or conditional registration fees for vehicles in the Historic Vehicle Scheme?

There are no increased costs for conditional registration or CTP insurance during the period of the log book trial. A review will be conducted on many aspects of the trial and costs will be included. A decision as to whether an increase in costs will apply to those that opt-in to the trial will be made subject to the outcome of the review.

I am a member of more than one recognised club. Am I entitled to more than one log book? *No. Only one log book will be issued per historic vehicle.* 

I have more than one historic vehicle conditionally registered under the Historic Vehicle Scheme. Am I entitled to more than one log book?

Yes. You are eligible to apply for a log book for each vehicle you have registered under the Historic Vehicle Scheme as long as the respective recognised club is participating in the log book trial.

#### MASH Branch Northern Coffee Run to Cataract Dam - 23/10/15

The weather forecast must have been generated by a computer as it read: "10% chance of rain, amount of rain 0 mm". So 9 times out of 10 it wouldn't rain but 1 day in 10 0 mm of rain would fall. Both the windscreen and the occupants of our car stayed 100% dry despite the overcast outlook so I guess one of the possibilities was correct - but which one it was entirely eludes me!

This month's destination was Cataract Dam which seemed rather appropriate given that it was constructed in the veteran era: work started in 1902 and was completed in 1907. The dam wall was castellated with sandstone blocks with a castle like valve house situated in the middle. Cataract is the oldest and possibly the most picturesque dam in Sydney's water supply system. The 56 metre high dam holds water from a 130 square kilometre catchment, forming an 850 hectare lake with a capacity of 94,300 megalitres. It supplies water to the Macarthur and Illawarra regions, the Wollondilly Shire, and metropolitan Sydney. The picnic grounds and facilities are fabulous and the gardens very nice in part thanks to the garden competition that used to be held between dams in NSW.

Our route took us via the Broughton Pass Weir which was constructed in the 1880s. It is quite picturesque and as passes go fairly veteran friendly.

This month's run was a fairly intimate affair with 2 veterans and moderns. The men gathered around the T Ford speedster discussed carburation, lowering, exhaust systems and overhead valve conversions. The women (so I am told) discussed the men and their obsessions. Apparently a rather attractive woman walked by and none of us men noticed. Regardless of the truth or otherwise of that observation I am guessing that none of us men would entertain any thought of contradicting our beloved wives. The women concluded that



#### 1914 Delaunay Belleville 'O type', 7+ Litre Engine

(This is one of 55 built for Military and the State between 1913 and 1916)

This Delaunay Belleville was once described in an English veteran and vintage car magazine as the 'The Car Magnificent'.

It was also regarded as the French Rolls Royce, a tag that I thought was a little over the top as it fell short of the Rolls Royce.

It was supposedly once a French Army staff car which somehow made its way to Australia and resided in Melbourne. Note the dual rear wheels for ease of desert and hard driving.

Taken from some jottings of the Late George Green.

'In the mid 1960 on returning from a veteran rally in Tasmania via Melbourne with his friend the Late Jack Jefferies, (Jack driving his Locomobile and I the Prince Henry Vauxhall we learnt of a very large car in the back yard of a Melbourne suburb. To our surprise there was a very large Delaunay Belleville sitting in the backyard with pieces of gal iron over it. The



owner thought, as everyone else seemed to, that it was a vintage car as it was imported into Australia during the 1920's.

I felt sure it was a veteran and turned the motor over with the stirring stick and it was quite free. We then started to get down to business. We assured the owner we would restore it to the standard of our live cars and we were successful in concluding a deal. I was anxious to get a car with a round radiator for my collection, but Jack was quite keen on the car so we tossed. I lost, but asked Jack if he decided to sell at any time to give me first refusal.

After half restoring the car Jack decided he did not want it so I acquired it. At the same time George Williams who had acquired a small Delaunay Belleville that I had tried to buy from its original owner in Canberra asked me if I was interested. I paid George out for the work he had done and acquired two round radiator cars within a week.'

(Jack Jefferies was the Mercedes Benz dealer in the Eastern Suburbs)

In the 1960's on the way to an Easter Rally in Canberra our convoy had been considerably delayed on route due to constant breaking down of the Delaunay and driving around Lake George at about 10.00 p.m. a Valiant crossed to the wrong side of the road and collected the Delaunay under the front right hand side wheel and the Delaunay came and rested upside down in the ditch. The Valiant continued on and ended up over the ditch through a fence and 50 metres into a ploughed paddock. The driver of the Valiant claimed he was not speeding. As the car came to rest upside down petrol spilt onto the driver and co-driver as the fuel tank was directly in front of them. Another saving device which gave the guys some clearance from the ground was an Esky which ended up on the back of the front seat.

The Insurance Company was prepared to write the car off, but George Green would not accept it and proceeded to restore the car for the second time.

For the 1970 International Rally for Veteran and Vintage Cars, I drew the short straw and drove the car to Melbourne. How lucky I was. With my wife of a few months and my best man we had:-

16 flat tyres,

Caught on fire due to a small back fire through the carburettor which could have been extinguished by throwing a blanket over but some overzealous chap on the Vintage Denis Fire engine emptied the contents of a fire extinguisher into the engine bay.

The following 3 days we coughed and splutted into Albury.



While at the Hume Weir motor racing Circuit and quietly waiting our turn to do our laps a New Zealand car backed into our rear mudguard. The next 2 days we were in a panel beaters shop.

Would you believe it, we won the hard luck trophy of the rally.

The return trip to Sydney was uneventful without any hitch and we did the trip to 2½ days.

I swore I would never drive that car again and just stayed with the Silver Ghost fleet in the George Green stable.

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
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
